
HOW TO GET TO THE SECC

PUBLIC TALK & TEACHINGS

VENUE

The public talk and teachings will take place in Hall 4 of the SECC.

PUBLIC TALK

The public talk starts at 3.00pm on Saturday.

TEACHINGS

His Holiness the Dalai Lama will teach for two sessions each day from Sunday to Tuesday.

DOORS & SECURITY

Doors will open one hour before the start of each session.

A security check will be carried out each time that you enter the hall. Please allow plenty of time to clear security before finding your seat.

Please arrive on time as late commers may not be admitted.

MONKS FROM TASHI LUNPO MONASTERY

Half an hour before the start of each teaching session, monks from Tashi Lunpo Monastery will be chanting prayers on the stage. We ask that you observe silence during this time.

CHILDREN - (For crèche information under 'Facilites')

Children accompanied by an adult are welcome but you are requested to ensure that they do not disturb others.

There is no charge for babes in arm, but you must collect a ticket at the entrance.
